Do you know anyone who has a collection? What do they collect?

Charmaine has an international doll collection. Here, she talks about the very first doll that started the collection.

Listen and read along with her, then do the activity to check to see if you understood everything.

Spencer: Can you tell me about the first doll you bought?

<u>Charmaine</u>: The first doll I ever bought with my own money was the doll you are looking at now. It looks like it should be Spanish, but it came from Mexico City.

When I was about eight (8), my parents decided we should drive from upstate New York to Mexico City for vacation. We went for 6 weeks. It's about 2700 miles between Schenectady and Mexico City, so it was a very long drive, and we—because of the time it was, it was the early 1960s, there weren't too many Americans around—so we were treated like royalty, at least at the time, I remember that.

We had a wonderful guide. His name was Carlos, and he was good. He took us (to) all sorts of places, including the murals by Diego Rivera and also to the floating gardens of Xochimilco, and I remember the way that he told us to say it was to say "such-a-milk-cow".

So that's the story of the first doll I ever collected.



REVIEW: HOW TO WRITE A QUESTION IN ENGLISH THAT ASKS FOR INFORMATION:

<u>Word order</u>: 1. The question word comes first: WHO, WHAT, WHEN, WHERE, WHY, HOW, HOW MANY, AT WHAT TIME, WHICH

- 2. the **helping verb** comes next: DO or DOES
- 3. the **subject** comes next: I, YOU, HE, SHE, IT, WE,

THEY

4. the main verb comes next

Example: Where do you work? Why doesn't Nina visit? When
does the show begin? How do you make lasagna?

*In the past tense, the helping verb is DID

Where did you work? Why didn't Nina visit? When did the show begin? How did you make lasagna?

<u>Practice</u>: Here are the answers. Can you think what the question was? Start off with a question word suggested by the underlined part of the sentence. Careful: there is present and also past tense!)
